HERE IS A SUMMARY OF THE PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTERING

In New Jersey, you must be registered to vote at least **21 days** before an election.

And, your registration must reflect your **current address**.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN NJ?

You must be:

- A United States citizen
- At least 17 years old, though you may not vote until you have reached the age of 18
- A resident of the county for 30 days before the election
- A person not serving a sentence of incarceration as the result of a conviction of any indictable offense under the laws of this or another state or of the United States.

CHECK IF YOU ARE ALREADY REGISTERED

Sometimes there may be a question about whether you are registered to vote in New Jersey and what address is in the record. For example, you may have registered when you got your Drivers License; or perhaps you can't remember if you changed your address. NOTES FOR STUDENTS

You can register to vote as soon as you are 17 years old. Your registration will be activated on the day that you reach the age of 18.

If you are in College, you may register to vote at your school address or at your home address. The choice is yours. When making your decision, you might consider how hard it is to get home to vote, or to request a mail-in ballot, or the relative ease of reaching the polling place associated with your school address.
